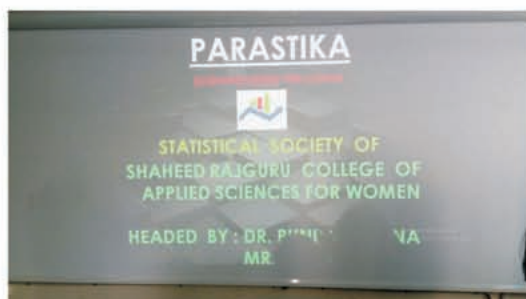


Heal-thy Self

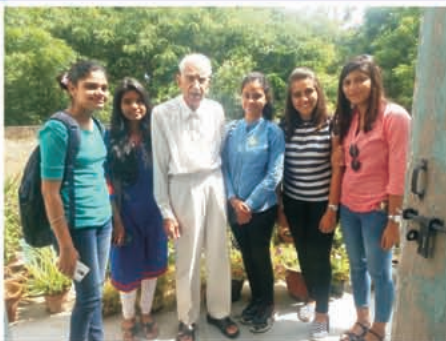
Social Initiatives
