

Report of Youth Parliament Society for Academic Year 2022-23

1. 16th National Youth parliament

16th National Youth parliament was organized by **Youth Parliament Society** of Shaheed Rajguru College of Applied Sciences for Women, University of Delhi on 25th August 2022. This Inter college competition was meant with the objective of encouraging all the students irrespective of their department to hone their leadership skills as well as to enact the working of parliament of India. A mock parliament was set-up and exposure to the parliament type debate were held. It is organized at the university level under the aegis of the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs. There was a warm welcome followed by a welcome speech by the anchors and lighting of the lamp. The chief guest was honored by the TIC of the Physics department, Dr. Alka Vohra. 2. Tarun Sabha
